MEETING SPACES

Triple J Lodge:

The triple J lodge is the camp's dining hall and a meeting space that can be set up to meet for a variety of needs. It features a large screen for presentations, a sound system, Wi-Fi access, and plenty of space for a variety of seating and table arrangements.



The Barn

The barn is separated into two meeting spaces, one is a casual lounge space and the other is a flexible space that can be set up for working on arts and crafts, a small conference area, or an effective workspace. This building is equipped with flat screen TVs that can connect to your laptop, and has access to our Wi-Fi network.



Pavilion

The pavilion offers a close-to-nature feel with the shelter of a large covered area. This space can be set up in a variety of seating or table arrangements for up to 200 people. It has a large fireplace and access to electricity. This area can be set up with a small stage, mobile sound system, or mobile projector upon request.



Council Campfire

Council campfire is the perfect place for evening group gatherings. It features gorgeous views, a large stage, a campfire pit and seating for up to 200 on pine benches.

Starlight Amphitheater

Starlight amphitheater is a rustic campfire area with a small stage, located close to cabins and yurts it can accommodate up to 200 people on log seating.





SLEEPING ACCOMODATIONS

10 Cabins

Each cabin has 7 twin-sized bunk beds for a maximum capacity of 14 participants and has private restroom and shower facilities.



7 Yurts

Each yurt is equipped with 6 twin-sized bunk beds for a maximum capacity of 12 participants. They are located near a large shower house and restroom.





Y- STAFF LED ACTIVITIES

Buzz Climbing tower: Our one-of-a-kind tower opens an entire world of climbing to your group's members. Created in the shape of Idaho, our tower provides unique bouldering and sport climbing options.

Zip line: Our 600' zip line lets you fly across the wetlands and feel the wind in your face. Participants must be at least 12 years old

High V: The High V is a team challenge that consists of two cables suspended between two poles. Participants work in pairs to traverse; beginning close together and getting further apart as they traverse, forming a "V".

High Circuit: Our high circuit is made up of 4 high ropes elements, each challenge is mounted 30-40 feet in the air and participants make their way across cables or balance beams all while safely belayed by one of our trained staff members.

Giant Swing: Get ready to fly! In this challenge, a participant is hauled in the air by their 10-15 team members on belay. Once at a desired height, the participant releases themselves from a snap shackle and swings like a pendulum.

Teambuilding and Low Circuit: Using a series of games, challenges and fixed low elements, our staff will lead your group through learning to problem-solve, use effective communication and conquer new challenges.

Canoeing: Learn basic canoeing strokes then spend time paddling around our serene no-wake reservoir.

BMX Pump Track: Hop on a bike and have a go on our pump track. Race around curves and up and down small hills and other features.





Y- STAFF LED ACTIVITIES

Guided Mountain Biking: We have a full fleet of mountain bikes suitable for ages 10 up to adult. Our Y Camp staff can lead your group on a trek around camp and through the adjacent forest areas. Terrain includes old logging roads, single track, and some gravel roads.

Archery: Are you brave enough to test the archer in you with our recurve and compound bow? Our newly designed archery program is built to accommodate novice as well as intermediate archers.

Arts & Crafts/Tie Dye: Our staff can lead your group in a variety of arts and crafts activities, or bring along a white t-shirt and we will lead you through creating your own tie-dyed clothing.

Outdoor Adventure: Our experienced staff can lead a variety of outdoor adventure and outdoor living skills, including fire building, shelter building, fishing, foraging for wild foods, outdoor cooking, primitive traps, map and compass skills etc. Ask for a comprehensive list of outdoor adventure options.

Outdoor Education: We believe that the outdoors are the perfect classroom for learning about our natural world and we offer a variety of educational courses tailored to our unique ecosystem. Ask for a comprehensive list of outdoor education options.

S.T.E.M. Education: We offer a variety of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics activities that will help you develop your inventive side and gain a deeper understanding of the way the world works.

Evening Activities: Our staff can lead your group in a variety of evening activities, including a night hike, indoor or outdoor astronomy, an entertaining campfire program, or a S.T.E.M. Challenge night.
