Two Treasure Valley YMCA Locations Serving Free Meals for Kids All Summer
Caldwell YMCA and Wilder Y Kids sites participating in summer food program

Caldwell, Idaho – The Treasure Valley Family YMCA now has two summer food sites open to the public for FREE summer meals for any youth under the age of 18.

The Caldwell YMCA Facility is serving breakfast from 8-9:30 a.m. and serving lunch from noon-1 p.m. Monday through Friday. Meals must be eaten on site at this location and children must be present to receive a meal. The summer meal service at Caldwell began Tuesday, May 27.

Wilder Y Kids is serving breakfast from 8:30-9 a.m. and serving lunch 12:30-1 p.m. at the park across from the Mercer building. Children must be present to receive a meal, but meals can be taken off site from this location. The summer meal service at Wilder begins Monday June 2.

“Ensuring kids have access to nutritious meals during the summer months at these free meal sites is one way we live our cause for Youth Development and support the health and well-being of every young person in our community,” said Teresa Wood-Adams, Vice President and Chief Youth Development Operations Officer at the Treasure Valley Family YMCA. “At the Y, we’re proud to provide a safe, welcoming space for all, where every child and family can feel supported and cared for.”
